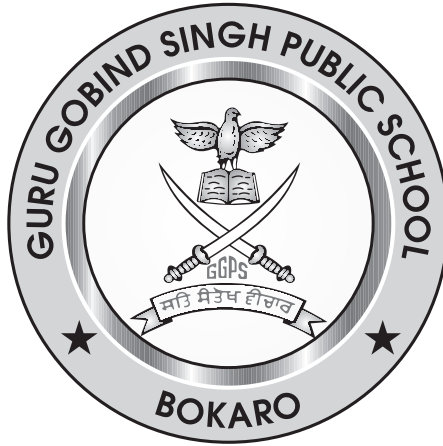

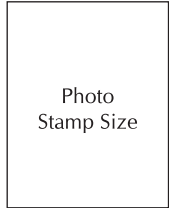

SIKHISM & GURU GOBIND SINGH JI

Sikhism was founded by the first Guru, Sri Guru Nanak Dev ji as a reformation of the then prevailing religions infested by ritualisms, dogmas and superstitions. The word 'Sikh' is derived from the Pali 'sikha' or Sanskrit 'Sisya' meaning disciple. A sikh believes in One Immortal Being and The Guru Granth Sahib. The sikhs form a vibrant community not only in India but all over the world. The teachings of Nanak were taken further by his successors,

Guru Gobind Singh ji, Guru Granth Sahibji

Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Guru was born in 1666 at Patna. He was ordained as a Guru at the tender age of nine, after his father Guru Tegh Bahadur laid down his life in the court of Aurangzeb for the cause of Kashmiri Pandits.

Guru Gobind Singh was one of the greatest personalities of all times. In him were united the qualities of a spiritual leader and a warrior. He stood for human freedom, secularism, democratic principles and pleaded for man's inalienable rights. He was a perfect man for the needs of the time. He left for his heavenly abode at the age of 42 in 1708 AD at Nanded, Maharashtra. Prior to this, he gave Guruship to Sri Guru Granth Sahib. For the Sikhs, Guru Granth Sahib is looked upon as embodiment of the Guru. It is not merely a collection of hymns but also is the 'Divine Word'. The message of love, truth, contentment, humility, fatherhood of God, brotherhood of man restraint on passions, purity of mind and body and search for the self form the subject matter of The Granth Sahib.

INTRODUCTION OF GGES

Guru Gobind Singh Public Schools are run by the Guru Gobind Singh Educational Society, an autonomous organisation, registered in April, 1979 with the Government of undivided Bihar. The pioneering efforts of the Sikh officers of BSL under the able guidance of Late Shri G.S. Grewal are enshrined in the school history. The Society has its headquarter at GGPS, Sector-V/B, Bokaro Steel City. The other branches are at Chas, Dhanbad, Daltonganj, Mohali and Hoshiarpur. The Society also runs a Technical Campus (Engineering & M.B.A), named G.G.E.S.T.C Kandra, Chas, Bokaro.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY

3. It would be mandatory for every GGPSian to communicate in English only since it is the medium of instruction.
4. Students should be regular and punctual in their attendance on school days.
5. Students should be polite & courteous in and outside the school campus.
6. Students should respect the school rules and regulations of their teachers, the liberty and rights of others.
7. Students are expected to nurture and pursue all good habits shedding off undesirable ones to create a healthy and safe surrounding .
8. Students should be diligent and never procrastinate the duties and obligations assigned to them.
9. Students should be proud of their uniform & maintain it with due regard.
10. Cleanliness in all respects should be given utmost priority for healthy & hygienic environment in and around the school.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS /GUARDIANS

The School believes in discipline, obedience and promptness. Disregard of school rules, deteriorating performances and long absenteeism will lead to disciplinary action amounting even to the issuance of a transfer certificate.

1. Parents/Guardians are allowed to meet the respective Class teacher in the reception area /Office of Vice Principal in the stipulated time only with visitor's card. No parent will be entertained without visitor's card for safety reason.
2. The school is to be informed if there is any change in the address or telephone number of the parents/Guardian.
3. Once the child gets into the school, the child will not be allowed to go out except for extreme exigency.

4. No parents will be entertained without escort card for safety reason.
5. No change in the details entered in the admission register of the school as supplied by the parents will be entertained under any circumstances.
6. Children when sick specially suffering from infectious diseases should not be sent to school .
7. Attendance of Parent / Guardian is mandatory on Parent Teachers' Meet.
8. Parents /Guardians would have to pay a fine of Rs 50/- for issue of duplicate report card/escort card/identity card in case of loss of the original report card/escort card/identity card.
9. Name/admission/number/class/section & House of the students should be clearly marked on his/her belongings such as bag, blazers etc.
10. Care must be taken of school property and any damage caused by the students will have to be compensated by the concerned student/Parent.
11. Children are not allowed to bring any costly articles to school. In case of loss of any such article, the school authorities will not be responsible in any manner.
12. Mobile Phone, electronic gadgets like camera, cell phone, ipods, electronic audio and other harmful/objectionable items like drugs, alcohol, crackers are strictly prohibited in school campus. Mobile phone would be confiscated if found in the school campus. Non compliance of these instructions can result even in expulsion from the school.
13. **Parents/guardians will appreciate the fact that leave is not granted in the best interest of the students. In case leave is unavoidable, they must meet the coordinators/Vice Principal respectively and get it sanctioned.**

14. **Parents/guardians are requested to cooperate with the school in its attempt to help in the progress of their wards by paying attention to regularity, punctuality, discipline and by taking interest in the assignments given.**
15. **Parents/Guardians should check the Almanac everyday and make note of the instructions given therein. In case of children studying till standard V, the parents/guardians are advised to check the bag of their wards to see if any notice/invitation /assignment has been given.**
16. **Parents/Guardians can meet the Principal or write in a separate letter addressed to him/her in case of legitimate complaint. The Principal will look into the matter personally.**
17. Parents/guardians must ensure that the mobile no is mentioned in the due place for SMS alert and updated in case of any change.
18. Parents/Guardians should bring Escort Cards while coming to school.
19. Ragging in any form in the school campus is strictly for bidden.
20. Stealing books/money/personal belonging of peer students would lead to strict action from the school authorities.
21. Damaging school property/bursting crackers/using abusive languages/sexual abuse/any sort of pornography/bullying/playing with colours/fighting with peers/disobeying school rules would lead to serious consequences and action against the pupil.
22. Demerit cards would be issued by the school authority in case of non-compliance of school rules. Issue of third demerit card to the same pupil would lead to suspension from the school.
23. **Students must come to school in school uniform only. The rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes or even after school hours.**
24. Violation of school rules, disobeying teachers and instructions of House masters would lead to strict action from the school.

1. Students scoring 85% and above in aggregate in class XI are given scholarship in the form of tuition fee waiver either in partial or full.
2. All meritorious students are awarded trophy and certificate for excellence in academics and co-scholastic areas.
3. Certificates and medals are given to students for their punctuality meaning 100% attendance.

HOUSE SYSTEM

There are four houses in the school : Pawan, Pani, Dharat and Akash. Every student becomes a part of one of the houses on admission to the school.

Each house is taken care by one student designated as the house captain. He/She is assisted in his/her duties by a Cultural and a Sports captain of the House. RULES OF WITHDRAWAL

1. A clear one month's notice must be given before a student applies for withdrawal from the school along with a written application and duly filled withdrawal form from parents.
2. Transfer certificate will be issued on payment of Rs. 250 (within one week) from the date of deposit of fee settlement/ clearance of all school dues.
3. Caution money will not be adjusted against any other dues and will be released only after the Transfer Certificate is issued.
4. Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within three months of leaving school.
5. In case an existing student stops attending school without intimating the school authorities, all dues of the school have to be paid till the end of the academic year.
6. Transfer certificate will not be issued during Summer Vacation.
7. A student failing for more than 2 years in the same class will not be permitted to continue in the School.

RULES OF ABSENCE

1. No student would be permitted to leave the school campus during school hours. However, in case of emergency, one authorized guardian should come to the school with application stating the reason for taking his/her ward. However, the decision would be entirely on the discretion of the Principal/Vice Principal to be satisfied & let go after filling the requisite proforma.
2. No student who was absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without the permission of the class teacher.

3. Reported absence for more than three consecutive days without granting of leave would have to be granted by the respective Vice Principal of the concerned wing.
4. Attendance would not be permitted to students who leave the campus after appearing in the periodic test. However his/her periodic test would be assessed.
5. Reported absence without granting of leave or unexplained absence for seven consecutive days may result in student's name being struck off from rolls. Re-admission may be granted at the discretion of the Principal/Vice Principal on payment of fresh admission fee.
6. It is mandatory for every student to have at least 85% attendance to appear in mid-term test /Half-yearly /Pre-Board /Annual Examination. Those who fail to fulfill this criterion may be barred from the respective examination. The relaxation in attendance will be granted on two grounds as suggested by CBSE.
 - a. Medical Ground
 - b. Mishappening in the family.The relaxation in the attendance may be granted subject to the full satisfaction of the Principal.
7. A student suffering from an infectious/contagious disease should produce a Doctor's Certificate. Discharge slip would be mandatory in case of hospitalisation of the student.
8. No re-examination would be held for the students who remain absent in any of the examinations.

RULES FOR LIBRARY

1. The School library is open for both teachers and students from 8.00 am to 5.00 pm. At least one library period is assigned to each class during one week.
2. Silence is to be observed in the library.
3. Students who keep books longer than the time permitted shall be fined @ Rs. 5.00 per day.
4. Books in the reference section shall not be taken out of the library.

5. Students should not write or tear anything out of the library books and return it in good condition.
6. Attention of the Librarian should be drawn towards the damaged books which are to be borrowed.
7. Students are entitled to issue one book at a time and keep the same for seven days.
8. Issue of books may be suspended any time by the order of the Principal.
9. All books taken from the library must be returned two weeks before the Final examination.
10. T.C. will not be issued unless a clearance certificate is obtained from the Librarian.

Rules to be observed in the Laboratories

1. Students should maintain silence and working atmosphere in the Laboratory.
2. Seat, instruments & practical records are to be well arranged & kept tidy by the students.
3. No equipment or chemicals, except the one issued for the practical should be handled by the students.
4. Glassware, apparatus & other equipments should be handled with extreme care. **Fine will be imposed on all breakage or damage caused to the equipments.**
5. Students will bring to the notice of the teacher /instructor the report of the damaged equipments immediately.
6. Use of White Lab coat is mandatory in all the Science Laboratories
7. Laboratory is to be left clean & well arranged by the students after the completion of experiments
8. Students should not carry their own separate apparatus.

TRANSPORT FACILITIES

School buses are available for the students as per availability of the seats. The following rules are to be observed :

1. The school does not entertain any request for change of bus-stops. **School reserves the right to increase the bus fare at any time to meet the increasing cost.**
2. For canceling the bus pass, a notice of **clear 30 days** from the 1st day of the month from which the bus facility is not required is to be submitted in the office.

BUS RULES

1. The bus Pass should be carried by the student always when using the bus facility.
2. Anyone found traveling by school buses without valid pass will be asked to pay bus fare for the entire month.
3. If a child needs to avail a trip other than the scheduled one prior permission of the Vice Principal or Principal is required.
4. Students availing bus facility are expected to be on the proper side of their bus stop, at least five minutes prior to the scheduled time of the arrival of the bus.
5. Students waiting for the buses should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
6. **The Buses will not wait for late comers.**
7. No bus rider should come near the entry door of the bus until the bus has come to a complete stop.
8. All bus riders must occupy vacant seats immediately after boarding.
9. The drivers are authorised to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the Bus Incharge. The list of stops will be prepared keeping in view the convenience and satisfaction of bus riders and is subjected to change.
10. When the bus is in motion, students must not move around in

the bus. The riders must not have any part of their body out of the windows.

11. Nobody is allowed to eat in the bus.
12. The front door of the bus is only permissible for entrance and exit.
13. Bus Pass will not be cancelled for the students of Std. X and XII after the month of July for current academic year.
14. Object of any kind must not be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus.
15. Students will be held responsible for any damage to the buses caused by their negligence or deliberate act.
16. Shrieking, shouting or any unruly behaviour is never expected from the students.
17. The driver should not be distracted for any reason.
18. The teachers in the bus, students, and bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses and any violation of rules should be reported to the Principal.
19. The transport in-charge is to be consulted for details of bus routes.

RULES TO BE OBSERVED FOR THE PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES

1. Monthly Fees are to be **paid on working days** from the 1st day of the month to the 25th day between 08.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. In case 25th day of the month is a holiday, 26th day of month shall be considered as the last day for fee payment of the respective month.
2. No fees will be accepted on other days.
3. Non payment of fees beyond 2 months could be reason to send defaulter home and even **STRIKE OFF THE NAME FROM THE ROLLS**.
4. Results/Promotions will be held up till all dues are cleared September/March.
5. The names of the students who fail to pay fees for two consecutive months will be struck off from the school Roll and Re-admission (50% of admission fee) will be collected.
6. Late fee of Rs. 100 will be charged if the fee of the month is not paid within 25th day of the month.
7. Annual fee must be deposited on or before summer vacation.
8. Payment can be made on-line by card / cheque (on local banks only) payable to “Guru Gobind Singh Public School, Bokaro”. In case the cheque is dishonored, a penalty of Rupees 300 shall be imposed.
9. Do not entrust cash with very young children.
10. Fees for “February and March” and “May and June” are required to be paid by 15th February and 25th May respectively.
11. School reserves the right to increase fees, if necessary, at any time to meet the increasing cost.
12. All fees of first semester and second semester should be cleared before 25th September and 15th February respectively.

RULES FOR DISCIPLINE

At the Main Gate :

1. If any student late by five minutes, the committee will allow him/her by giving him/her warning. Late coming will be recorded in the pupil's Almanac and is to be signed by the Parents/Guardians. Class Teacher will verify the same the student will not get the attendance of that day.

Three times late arrival to the school will be resulting in him/her being send back home after calling the parents.

2. The committee will not allow the late comers to enter the school premises after five minutes and the Main Gate will be closed.

Assembly Area:

1. Proper Uniform of the students would be checked in the assembly every day.
2. If the student is not in his/her proper uniform, the class teacher will mention the complaint in his/her school Almanac. But after three consecutive reminders, the committee will take action and will decide to send him/her back along with his/her parent/guardian.
3. The disciplinary committee will also take action against those who have long hair and beard as well as improper uniform.
4. The dispersal of the students will take place class wise under the guidance of the class teachers.
5. The house masters and house teachers should not allow the students to go directly to the washroom during assembly.
6. Students will not leave their classroom without outgoing pass.

7. House masters and house teachers during recess are responsible for maintaining discipline floor wise.
8. House prefects (students) are also responsible for maintaining discipline during morning assembly, recess and dispersal.
9. House masters are responsible for the distribution of the duties among house teachers.
10. During the dispersal time house masters, house teacher and PETs will manage the dispersal after that they will do their assigned duty.
11. House teachers and house prefects will be assigned duties floor wise.
12. On the basis of the performance/behaviour of the students the committee will issue the merit and the demerit card. On the issuance of 3rd demerit card, the student will be suspended from the school.
13. If a parent/guardian report to the V. P. for taking his/her ward just after the Periodic Test, he/she will be marked absent for that day. However, his/her Periodic Test will be evaluated.
14. **Students must come to school in uniform only. This rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes or even after school hours.**

NON COMPLIANCE OF RULES

Action to be taken:

1. If a student is found in any in-disciplinary act, discipline committee must intervene in this matter. A written report must come to the Principal. On the basis of that the Principal must call a meeting with all the members immediately.
2. Based on the decision in the meeting, the following actions have to be taken-
 - a. **Parents call - warning** - written information in the school Almanac
 - b. **Parents call** - Suspension-Written Information (7-10 days) in the school Almanac.
 - c. **Parents Call** - TC

For a - If a student creates problem for the first time and the matter is not that serious.

b - If a student creates problem after warning and the matter is serious.

c - If a student creates problem after warning and suspension and the matter is serious.

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION

The entire academic session is divided into two terms: the first term assessment would be conducted based on syllabus of 30% followed by Mid term test comprising of half of the syllabus.
